

**FIRM RESUME OF
MCGANN, BARTLETT & BROWN**

The partnership of McGann, Bartlett & Brown is engaged in an active and expanding practice, with emphasis in workers' compensation litigation, throughout the State of Connecticut. While the firm does represent plaintiffs in civil litigation and Social Security matters, we are more often defending on behalf of insurance companies.

Richard S. Bartlett: Attorney Bartlett is a founding partner of the firm which was established in 1984. He graduated from the University of Connecticut School of Law with honors in 1981 and was admitted to the Connecticut Bar Association that same year. He received a Master's Degree in the field of Nutritional Biochemistry in 1974 and worked in that field prior to obtaining his law degree. He is a member of the Connecticut Bar Association, is admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court and is also admitted to practice in the U.S. District Court and the Second Circuit Court of Appeals. He has represented clients of McGann, Bartlett & Brown in over 25 matters which have been presented to the State of Connecticut Supreme and Appellate Courts.
